WHAT IS IT?

DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE) PROGRAM – WHAT IS IT?

Historically disadvantaged individual based on race, gender and national origin

- ✓ 51% owner must be disadvantaged individual
- ✓ Owner must control business operations
- ✓ Personal net worth less than \$1.32 million
- ✓ U.S. citizen or permanent legal resident

WHAT IS IT?

DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE) COMPLIANCE

FTA recipients, such as TARC, expects to award more than \$250,000 in FTA funds in prime contracts (excluding transit vehicle purchases) in a Federal fiscal year are required to set a three-year goals for DBE participation for this US DOT-assisted work in accordance to 49 C.F.R. § 26.45(a)

WHAT IS IT?

DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE) PROGRAM – WHAT IS IT & WHO MUST SET THE DBE GOALS?

Three components to the Department of Transportation (DOT) DBE Requirement:

1. The DBE Program (49 CFR, Part 26.21, Subpart B)
2. The DBE Triennial Goals/Methodology (49 CFR, Part 26.45, Subpart C)
3. Federal Transit Administration Semi-Annual DBE Reports

GOAL & METHODOLOGY REQUIREMENT

DBE GOAL SUBMISSION

1. Goal Setting and Methodology Requirement
 - ✓ The 3-year submission of goal setting and its methodology is due on August 1st.
2. What does TARC need to submit to FTA?
 - ✓ Letter stating overall goal for the three Federal Fiscal Years
 - ✓ Copy of the methodology used to develop the goal (Examples: worksheet, spreadsheet, charts, etc.) Refer to Slide 11
 - ✓ Copy of published notice informing the public of the DBE goal comment period
 - ✓ Consultation and Collaboration Process/Outreach Conducted

GOAL & METHODOLOGY REQUIREMENT

HOW IS THE DBE TRIENNIAL GOAL SET?

Step One –Base Figure Development

1. Anticipated FFY 2023, 2024, 2025 federally-funded projects & contracts - Identify contractible opportunities
2. Project Estimated = \$34,805,131
 1. Construction Projects - \$19,860,000 (57.1%)
 2. Technical Consulting Professional Services – \$11,474,109 (33.0%)
 3. Materials and Supplies - \$871,199 (2.5%)
 4. Professional Services - \$2,599,823 (7.5%)

GOAL & METHODOLOGY REQUIREMENT

3. Relative Availability by NAICS and Project Dollar Value
 - There are 31 potential contract for awards totaling \$34,805,131
4. NAICS codes Identified for each Project Opportunities
 - 82 NAICS codes categories
5. DBE certified firms UCPs (KYTC and INDOT) – by NAICS codes
 - Total 677 DBEs – 72 NAICS codes categories - Ready, Willing and able
 - Total 0 DBEs – 10 NAICS code categories
6. All firms by NAICS codes categories (Jefferson County Business Pattern Data- US Business Census)
 - Total firms (inclusive of DBEs) 5713 by NAICS code categories

GOAL & METHODOLOGY REQUIREMENT

7. Step One Calculation FFY 2023-2025
 - DBE firms = 677
 - All firms = 5713
 - Divide DBE firms / All firms = 11.85%
8. Step Two Adjustment Calculation – Race Conscious
 - DBE Historical Participation from FFY 2019-2021 Median = 8.23%
 - Add 8.23% + 11.85% = 20.08% Divide by 2 = 10.04%
9. DBE Weighted Goal FFY 2023, 2024, 2025
10. Goal 10.04% and \$3,494,435 Total Anticipated Dollars with DBE firms
 - Race Conscious of 6.01% and Race Neutral of 4.03%
