

Big changes are coming to TARC on August 2, 2026!



The New TARC Network will bring big changes to where bus routes go and increase the frequency of arrivals.



Turning up the Frequency

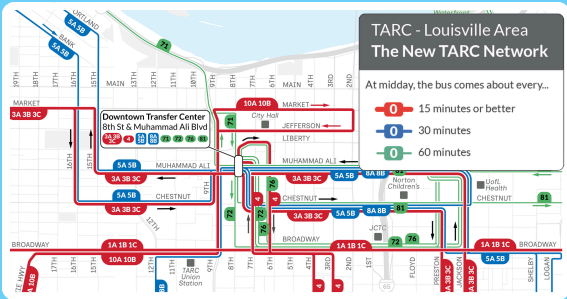
The New TARC Network is making it easier than ever to get around! With expanded 15-minute service on Broadway-Bardstown, Market, Preston, 4th Street and Dixie Highway, 35,000 additional residents will have access to frequent, all-day service. That means shorter wait times, and easier connections that give riders faster, more convenient, and more reliable service by adding more frequent service across the city.

New Routes, New Numbers

Most routes will receive new route numbers and route names — making the system easier to understand and use. To make the transition simple, a variety of helpful tools are now available on the TARC website, including a comparative trip planner, schedules, and rider guides.

Bus Stops are Changing

Many bus stops will be updated as part of the new network. TARC will be consolidating bus stops on many routes so average travel times are shorter and service more reliable. A list of all bus stop changes is available at ridetarc.org/new.



New Downtown Transfer Center

The New TARC Network will include a Downtown Transfer Center at Muhammad Ali Blvd. and 8th Street, where buses will meet in a coordinated “pulse,” allowing quick transfers between routes in just 5–10 minutes.

Clear Communication Every Step of the Way

TARC is conducting a major outreach campaign to help riders learn the new network. Flyers are being posted at all bus stops and ambassadors will be deployed across the city to help customers with the transition.
